YEAR 9 HISTORY TRIP TO BELGIUM AND FRANCE



In June, our Year 9 students embarked on a memorable four-day History trip to Belgium and Northern France, exploring key First World War sites around Ypres and the Somme. Students deepened their

understanding of the war through visits to significant cemeteries including Essex Farm, Langemark, and Tyne Cot, as well as the Passchendaele Museum and the interactive In Flanders Fields exhibition.

A highlight of the trip was attending the moving Last Post Ceremony at the Menin Gate, providing a powerful moment of reflection on the sacrifices made during the war. The following day, students travelled to France to visit Vimy Ridge, Newfoundland Park, the Thiepval Memorial, and the Lochnagar Crater, gaining further insight into the scale and impact of the conflict.

On Thursday 25 June, Drayton Manor welcomed author Malcolm Duffy to share his experiences of being a writer as well as running a workshop for students in Year 7 in the library at lunchtime. UCAS DAY

Our annual Year 12 UCAS Day provided students with a valuable opportunity to engage directly with higher education institutions and industry professionals as they begin to make decisions about their post-18 pathways. Representatives from a range of universities attended both in person and online, delivering subject-specific taster lectures and interactive sessions designed to give students a realistic insight into university-level study. Students also had access to expert guidance on key aspects of the university application process, including choosing a course and institution, student finance, personal statement writing, and

linking degree choices to future career aspirations. In addition, students benefited from specialist sessions focused on competitive applications, including Oxbridge and Medicine, as well as information on alternative pathways and support available throughout higher education.

The Future STEM Link Event, organised by a team of Year 12 students in partnership with Charity Den, provided students with an inspiring opportunity to explore a range of STEM career pathways and gain first-hand insight from professionals and academics.

As we wrap up another busy summer term, we are celebrating everything from Sports Day to our PE scholars, plus athletics, girls' rounders, and cricket. Here is what has been happening in Drayton Manor sport this half term.

ATHLETICS

It's been a standout term for Drayton Manor Athletics, with two Wilkinson Sword competitions showcasing the strength and depth of our athletes across the school.

On 1 May, our Junior (Years 8 and 9) and Intermediate (Years 10 and 11) athletes attended the competition at Perivale Park Athletics Track. A squad of 46 students, accompanied by Mr Bowman, Mrs Williams and Coach Sarim, went up against 16 other schools from across the Borough.



The results were superb. Congratulations to our Intermediate Girls and Intermediate Boys, who both took 1st place in their respective competitions, while the Junior Boys placed 2nd and the Junior Girls 4th. Across the day, our athletes claimed an impressive 7 gold, 9 silver and 8 bronze medals out of 46 events. Special mention must go to Sofia Mossi and Owen Stubbins, who each won 1st place in both of their individual events - a brilliant achievement.

Our Year 7 and Year 8 athletes then had their turn on 12 June to compete for the Wilkinson Sword. They brought home 4 gold, 6 silver and 1 bronze, with the following team performances: the Year 7 boys finished 3rd, the Year 8 boys tied for 6th, the Year 7 girls tied for 4th, and the Year 8 girls placed 4th. Notable individual performances came from Charlotte, Codie, Hugo, and Joshua who each won two medals in their events.



Overall, our team finished in 2nd and it was a brilliant showing from start to finish, with individual and team performances that we are incredibly proud of. The standard of our athletes remains as high as ever across all year groups, and the character, ambition and



resilience shown throughout the competition speak volumes about this group. We cannot wait for next season, when we will be back on the track, hungrier than ever to reclaim the Wilkinson Sword.
